

#### Two Minute Take-Aways

- NFL, NCAA Football and MLB remain most popular, while the NHL regains lost ground to reach statistical parity with the NBA.
- Strong popularity surges are evident for European Soccer, NCAA Men's and women's basketball. Boxing, horse racing and WNBA struggle
- Walking, fitness, running and cycling show greatest strength as recreational sports.
- Commissioner Stern goes out on a high, while Goodell and Bettman see rebound in fan approval.
- Fan tolerance for the proliferation of NCAA Bowl games improves, but fans reject college athlete pay for play; bristle at conference musical chairs.
- MLB fans welcome instant replay; Lament player movement; See a new Champion in 2014




#### Two Minute Take-Aways (continued)

- NBA fans grow more concerned about lack of competitive balance as nearly four in ten expect a "Re-Heat" in 2014. Fans skeptical about potential strong return for Derek Rose.
- NFL fans remain concerned with concussions but are still willing to "take the risk." They show strong aversion to a European based NFL team but extoll the league's competitive balance.
- Fans show little tolerance for polarizing players; do not bemoan the speed of the coaching axe.
- Some signs of cautious optimism and a more positive future, intertwine with lingering job security concerns.
- Fans learning to deal with information overload as the hesitancy to indulge shows some abatement.
- Child-centricity and a focus on service as a differentiator remain at the forefront for sports fans, as more valued family time fuels an appetite for vacations




### Background, Objectives and Methodology

- 2014 online survey of over 1,500 total respondents




Top Four Most Popular Sports Remain Unchanged While NHL Now at Parity with NBA

Which of the following sports do you participate in regularly, that is at least twice per month during season?






Perceived Popularity of Professional Sports: NFL Remains Top of the Hill; European Soccer, NCAA Men's Hoop, Surge

### Horse Racing, Track and Field Struggle Year Over Year





Difference Between Those Who Say A Sport is Gaining vs. Losing Popularity: Football continues to dominate. Big comeback for the NHL






### Approval Ratings on Commissioners: Stern Goes Out on a High; Goodell and Bettman Rebound








The Concussions Contradiction: Meaningful Shift in Concerns as Younger NFL Fans are More Willing to Trade Risk for Reward


